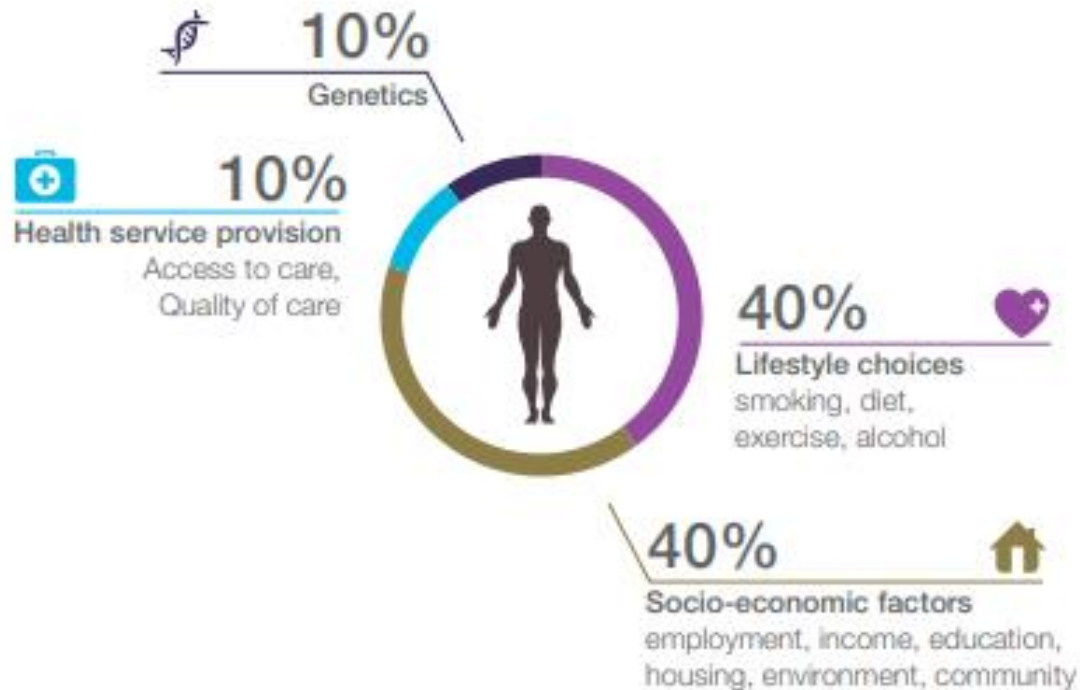

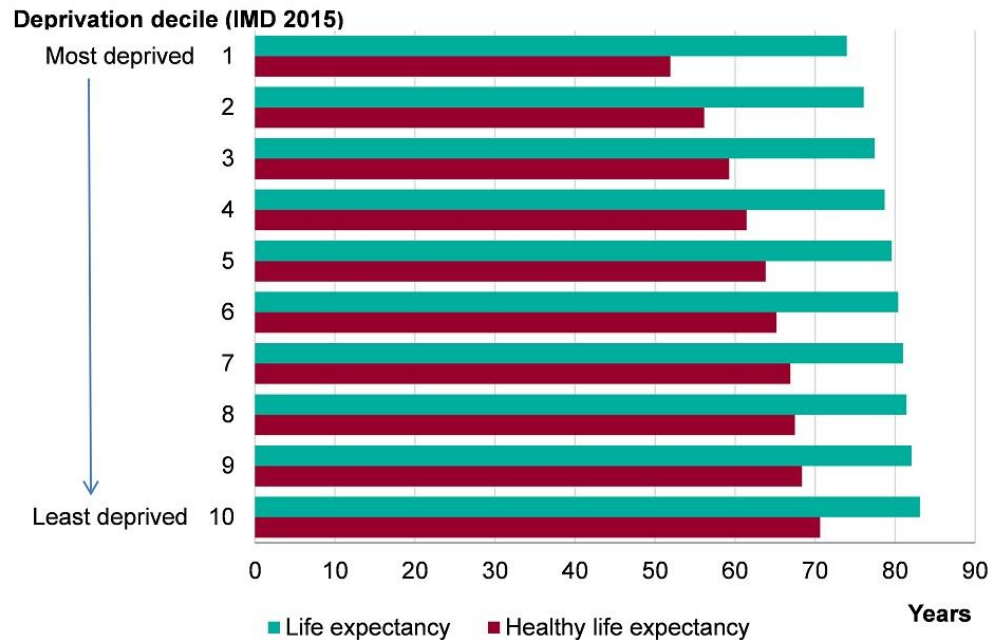

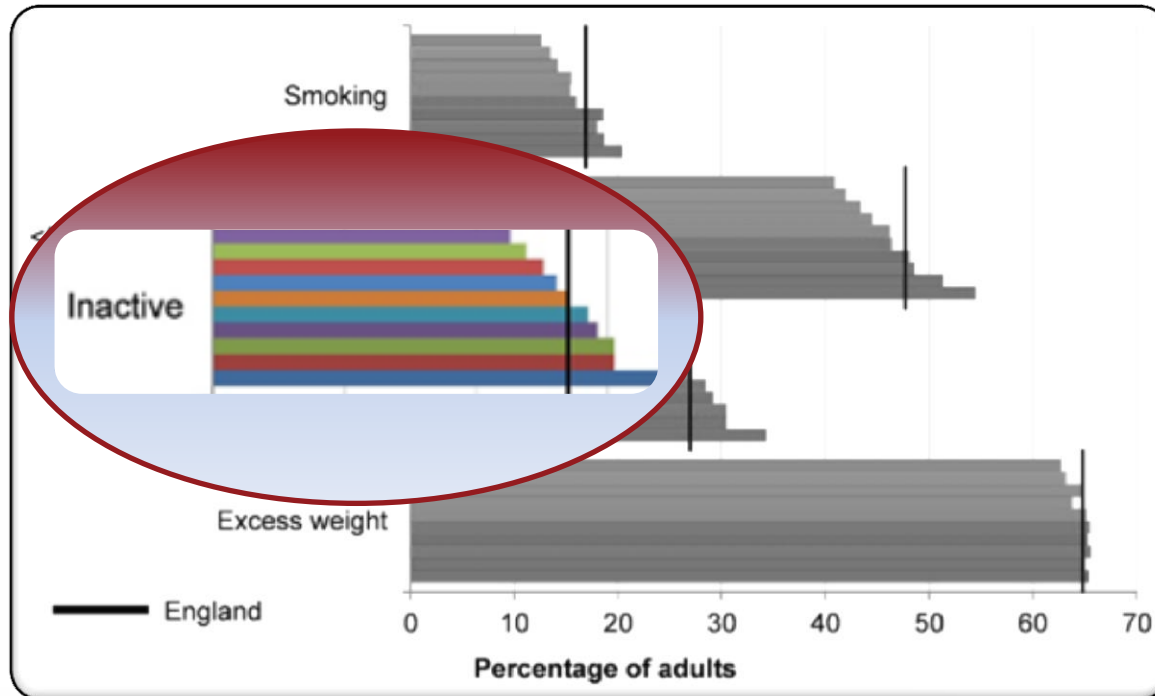


# National picture

Least deprived areas had lowest prevalence of risk factors



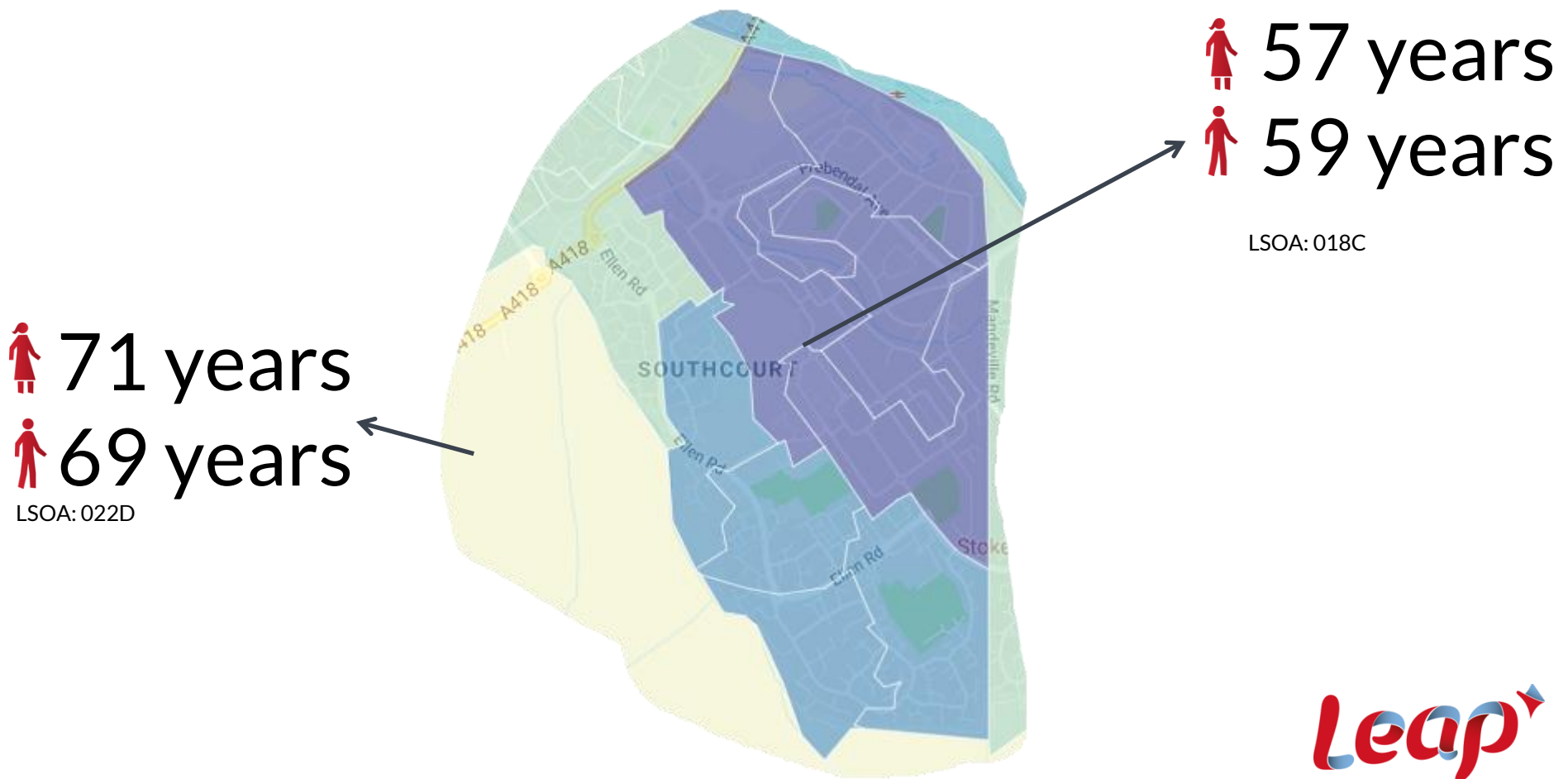
10 - least deprived 9 8 7 6 5 4 3 2 1 - most deprived

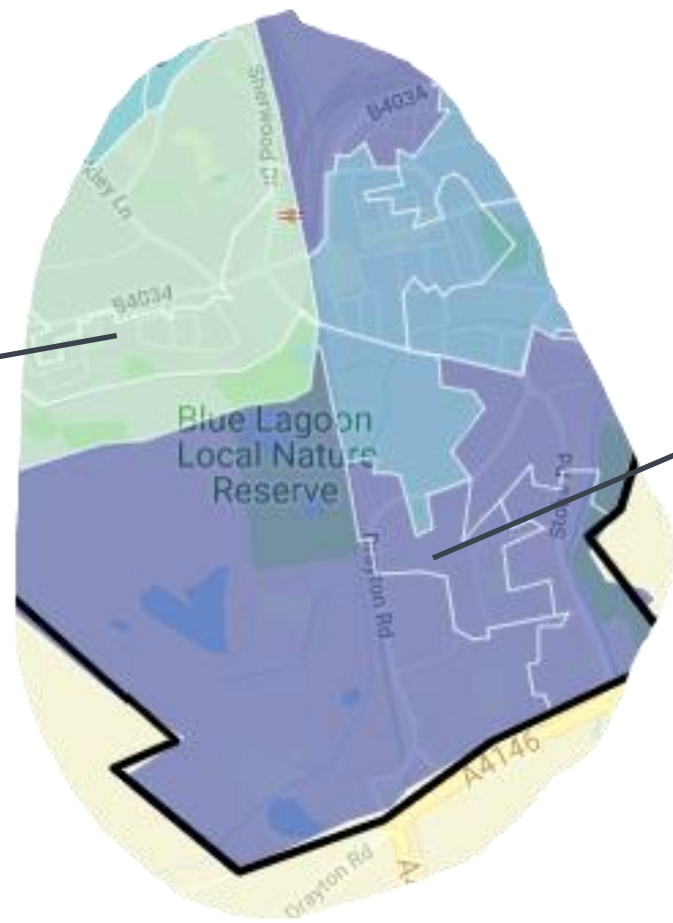

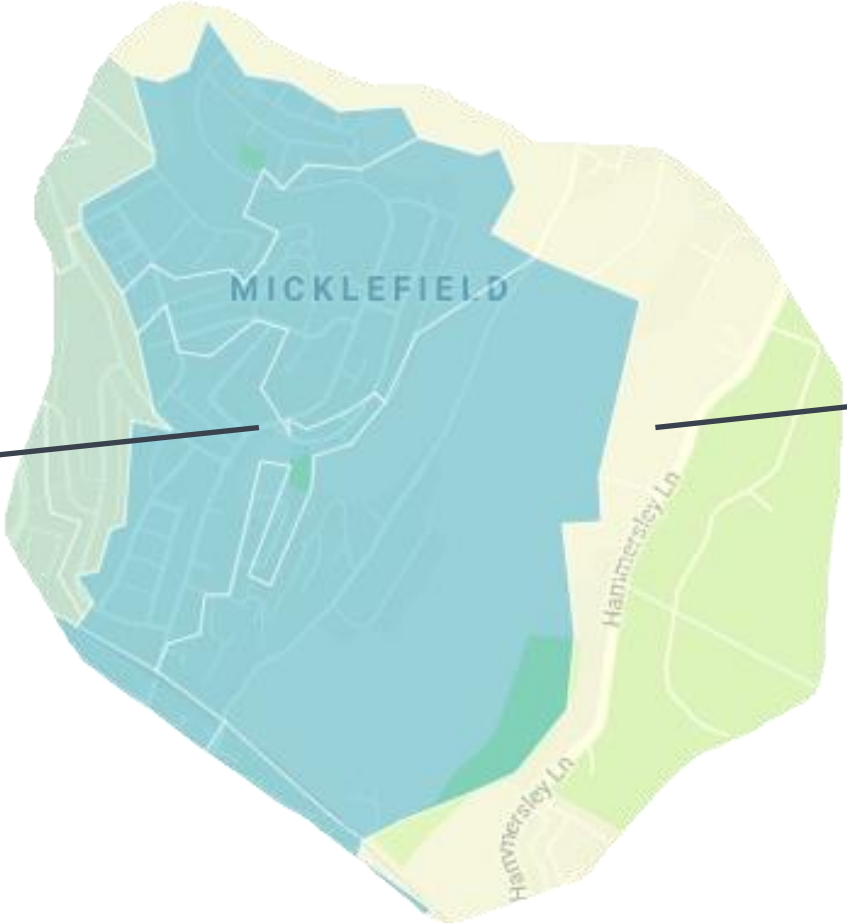

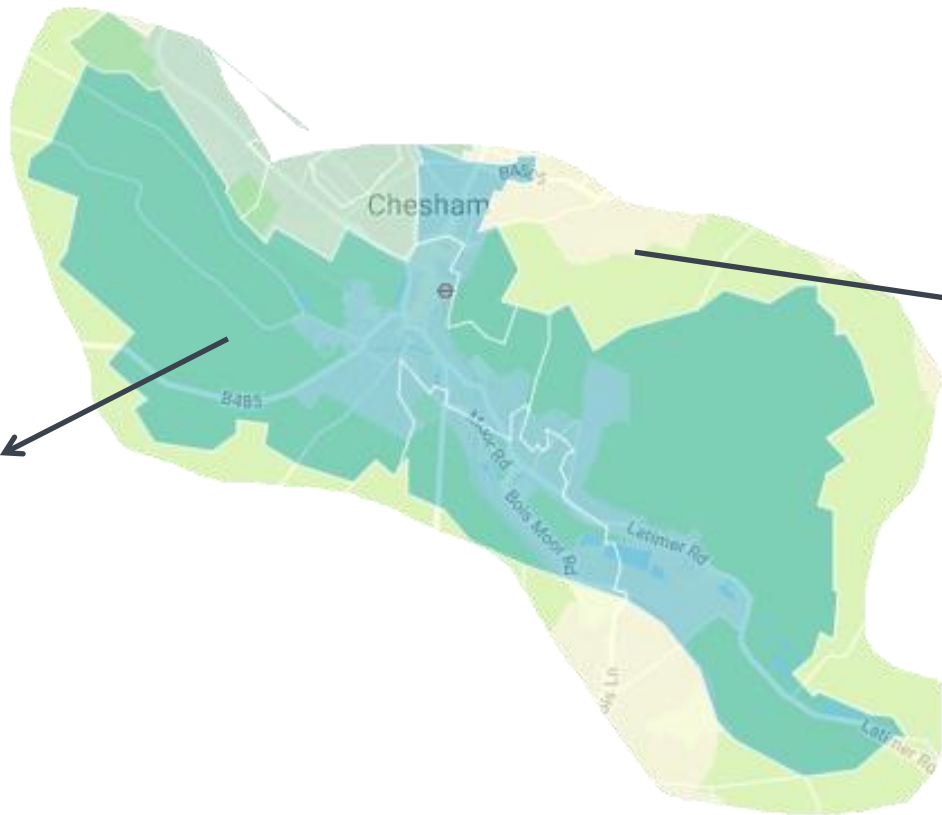
